Beautiful purpletinted, white flowers project 2' upward and carry an exotic perfume of grape and jasmine. Give it lots of water with full sun in most states for the darkest foliage.

#### **DEW** Agave 'Spot' (syn. Manfreda) (Cistus)

It tosses up 4' tall spikes terminating with fragrant, 1" long white flowers in summer. 'Spot' grows well in heat and humidity, but it must have good drainage. This wild, deciduous succulent looks like it traveled off the set of Star Trek! Grower Note: Plants do not show their spots until one year old from a tc plug.

#### Arum italicum ssp. italicum 'Winter White'

Leaves appear in late fall and are showy throughout the cold months to early summer. The plant's foliage pattern is not fully visible until it reaches maturity in its second year. #### Campanula persicifolia 'Kelly's Gold'\*

(Golden Peach-leafed Bellflower) The brilliant gold foliage gives rise to nice white flowers just kissed with blue at the edges. Originally found in Ann Holt's garden on Bainbridge Island, Washington, this unique form looks like it got hit by uranium; it positively glows! Prefers moist, loamy soil with good drainage. #### Campanula punctata 'Pantaloons'\* PP13282

'Pantaloons' surprises us with huge 2" light purple flowers that are shaped in a double "hose-inhose" like we've never seen before. Looks like an elaborate 1890's undergarment. (The plant will occasionally throw up single flowers). This plant is vigorous and reaches standard C. punctata height.

#### Caryopteris divaricata 'Snow Fairy'

(Variegated Bluebeard) Soft textured, feathery variegated foliage for the spring and summer garden. Slow to emerge in the spring, so add a bit of extra heat. Leaves edged white all season. Late summer bloom of gentle blue. Comes back from the base each spring, not old wood, and may require pinching or culling of green shoots. Our goals are to breed for flower size, bloom longevity, floriferousness, plant habit and hardiness. One of the backbones of this breeding program has been the extremely hardy Coreopsis auriculata 'Nana'.

Coreopsis 'Autumn Blush' PPAF PVR This hardy hybrid out of C. auriculata 'Nana' begins flowering in the late spring with 1" strawberry-eyed, butter-yellow flowers. Flowers form a midheight canopy of color, which changes as the season progresses. Cooler temperatures of late spring and fall enhance the strawberry coloration. Brilliant yellow, fern-like leaves are streaked green and erupt in fragrant purple flowers. This wonderful new mutation of C. 'Blackberry Wine' is one of the few Corydalis that does not go summer dormant. Its vigorous cascading habit makes it an excellent ground cover and looks great spilling out of baskets and over banks. #### Corvdalis flexuosa 'Purple Leaf' (Blue Dragon)

Up before the robins in spring (with its cousin 'Blackberry Wine'), this bronzy-leafed fumitory is vigorous, rhizomatous, early blooming and long lived. Plants are more compact than the type and are charming in the rock garden, or scrambling around stepping-stones. A great lacy contrast to Heuchera 'Lime Rickey'. Fragrant, violet-blue flowers abound in early spring. May go summer dormant. Z 5-9 ) qc/8/10 \*

#### Crocosmia x crocosmiiflora 'Solfatare'
